We received a report in relation to a theft of a catalytic convertor from a vehicle parked in the Whitworth Hospital carpark at the end of July. As a result, please see below around reducing the risk of this occurring.

Reduce The Risk

Garage your car whenever possible

Park in well-lit busy areas

Be aware of people looking under cars

If the car is high risk consider marking the metal shell of the converter with a unique mark, so that if it is removed by thieves, it will be easier to trace back to your vehicle

Fit a catalytic converter clamp or security cage.

If you require anymore crime prevention advice regarding catalytic convertor thefts, please come along to one of the street meets listed on the community engagements.
